DUAL ENROLLMENT TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Penn State's Dual Enrollment program offers high school students the opportunity to take college-level courses to supplement their high school curriculum.

For consideration, the student must submit:

- Dual Enrollment Terms and Conditions form signed by the student and parent/guardian.
- Official high school academic transcript from a high school guidance counselor.
- Completed Undergraduate Nondegree Enrollment Form.

Requirements and expectations for this program include:

- Students will be assigned to an adviser who has met clearance requirements in accordance with the Pennsylvania Child Protective Services Law.
- Students will only have access to sections of courses taught by instructors with these same clearances.
- To ensure dual-enrolled students do not inadvertently schedule an inappropriate course section, they must meet with their assigned adviser to schedule courses each semester and must contact their advisers to make any subsequent schedule changes.
- Seniors may take up to 8 credits per semester. Juniors are strongly encouraged to start with 1 course.
- A grade of C or better in each course taken is required for students to continue in the program.
- Students who have graduated from high school may not participate in this program.
- Shenango Dual Enrollment students will receive a scholarship in the amount of one-half of tuition for up to 8
 credits per semester while eligible in this program. The student is responsible for paying the remaining balance of
 tuition and fees.
